FRIENDS WITH YOU

In the 15th chapter of the gospel of John, Jesus says to his disciples, "I do not call you servants any longer, ... but I have called you friends ..."

Now, a pastor does not have the exact same relationship with those in the faith community in which they serve as Jesus did with his disciples, but there are some similarities. Jesus was preparing to leave those with whom he had been in ministry (to die on the cross). I find myself in a similar circumstance. I am leaving those with whom I have been in ministry for the past few years. (However, I don't anticipate having to leave you to face crucifixion.) Nevertheless, like Jesus and the disciples, the relationship between you and me is also changing. No longer will I refer to you as "my" parishioners, but early on the morning of July 1st, I will start calling you my friends. I will no longer be one of your pastors, but I will remain your friend, although one who is a friend from a distance.

Early in his career, singer/songwriter John Denver wrote a piece called "Friends with You." The words go like this:

What a friend we have in time
Gives us children, makes us wine
Tells us what to take or leave behind
And the gifts of growing old
Are the stories to be told
Of the feelings more precious than gold

Friends, I will remember you, think of you,
pray for you

And, when another day is through,
I'll still be friends with you

My Sisters and Brothers here at Towson UMC, what more can I say as I prepare to leave for my new appointment? I have loved being among you as one of your pastors. You have been so gracious to me and my husband John. I will hold you in my thoughts and in my heart each and every day, and ...

From the Senior Pastor

Dear Fellow Followers of Christ,

The time is nearing for me to begin in my new position as Assistant to the Bishop and many have been asking exactly what will I be doing. It is a longer answer than most want to hear and certainly longer than you want to read here. Most basically, I will be heavily involved in the recruitment and training of clergy to serve in the churches of our Conference, the complaint processes when there are issues, and assisting the Bishop in the implementation of the vision for the Conference.

In many ways this will be a very different role from the one I have had throughout my ministerial career. I have always served in a local church with the primary responsibilities of preaching, teaching, visitation, and administration. While having numerous responsibilities on the Conference level, my primary assignment has been to work with a congregation. My new assignment will require more administration and work with the leaders of congregations instead of the congregations themselves. I expect to preach regularly, but not in the same church each week, and teaching will be more related to training. No doubt there will be "other duties as needed" not specified in a job description.

Still, it occurs to me that, though my setting and responsibilities will be different, my job, if you will, will not be different at all. This is because my job is the same as all baptized Christians, generally, and the ordained, specifically, and that is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. Whether I am teaching a Bible study in my church, or preaching to my congregation, or praying with a parishioner in a home or hospital, or I am guiding clergy in best practices, or developing the skills of spiritual leaders, the call is the same — to make disciples of Jesus Christ. The Bible reminds us that in the field of faith development some prepare the field, some plant, some water, and some harvest. The tasks differ but the job is the same — to grow believers who demonstrate the fruits of the Spirit. In this respect, I am not changing jobs at all, just the tasks I need to do.

It is not my job alone. Clearly the job of making disciples of Jesus Christ requires many and, as mentioned, it is a job assigned to all baptized Christians. Only a small minority will lead churches. But it is your job to invite people to church and to invite people into a relationship with Christ. It is your job to participate in a mission to demonstrate God's care, and/or knit a prayer shawl or take a meal to the sick, and/or pray with the sorrowful to demonstrate God's love. It is your job to teach a class or lead a small group or work with the children or youth to communicate the essentials of the faith. It is your job to witness for Christ when you have opportunity and to live according to the ways of Christ and to conduct yourself with an attitude of mercy and grace so that others can see the Christ in you and want to be Christ-like also. You see the point. Making disciples of Jesus Christ is a job that belongs to all of us.

I am continuing that job in a way that is new to me. Please pray that I will do my part of the job well. Know that I am praying that you do your part well also. This glorifies God and blesses God's children. That is a win/win and a job worth doing.

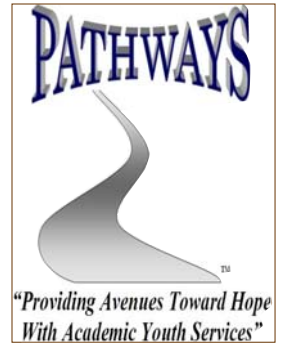

As I gather my thoughts for this newsletter, I am excited over the upcoming events that will benefit the PATHWAYS students. By the time you receive this, we will have completed our trip to Washington, D.C. to tour the White House and the Capitol, including a private tour of the Speaker's office. We have 41 students and 14 chaperons eagerly anticipating this journey on April 16th. Many prayers were answered that the government would not "shut down" and we are on our way!



Also on the agenda is the Putting for PATHWAYS golf outing that is being planned for the fall and headed up by board member, Lu Ann Blackman. She has done a fabulous job of beginning the initial planning with a large group of volunteers. We hope to make this an annual event, but the first year is always the most labor intensive. PATHWAYS is an all volunteer tutoring organization whose home base is Towson United Methodist Church, 501 Hampton Lane, Towson, Maryland 21286.

We tutor during the academic year and bus students from two Baltimore City and three Baltimore County low income schools each Tuesday. We have 2 sessions, 4-5 PM and 5-6 PM. There is no charge to the students or their families.

The program was started in 2006 and has grown in size each year. We tutor an average of 40 students a week. We receive both public and private funding to use for tutor training, student transportation, resources, snacks, holiday gifts, awards, and a culminating family dinner and celebration in May.

We are looking for an Assistant Director to work closely with the current Director on coordinating volunteers and special programs, interfacing with families and schools, and keeping any necessary records regarding attendance and academic progress.

This job would vary in hours, but generally would take an average of 5 hours per week. You need not have a teaching background, but organizational skills, dependability, flexibility, and good communication skills would be important.

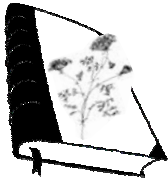
